Vision

For Gloucestershire to be a county where everyone can enjoy good sustainable food, and nobody goes hungry.

Mission

Feeding Gloucestershire will drive systemic change to build food security across all communities in Gloucestershire.

Aims and Objectives

Strategic Aims

- 1. To find sustainable solutions to helping people who are struggling with low incomes or debt to access good food that they can afford.
- 2. To champion systemic change to build food security, creating local, equitable and sustainable healthy food provision.
- 3. To reduce food waste.
- 4. To facilitate equitable access to emergency food provision.
- 5. To build community resilience and promote social inclusion, cohesion, and connection through food.
- 6. To help tackle the root causes of food poverty.

District Work

Each of our districts is unique and these district launches have given us the opportunity to identify the unique strengths of each district and also where support is needed – giving us the opportunity to connect across sectors. The role of Feeding Gloucestershire on both district and county level is to support and facilitate.

County Work

Currently we have several projects at district level -

- Free School Meals we are working with Gloucestershire County Council to look at the possibility of piloting Feeding Britain's pilot program to auto-enrol eligible children for free school meals.
- Healthy Start Vouchers Gloucestershire has a low uptake rate of Healthy Start Vouchers, so we are working with Gloucestershire County Council to promote the scheme and improve uptake.
- HAF Our focus with HAF work will be food education and enabling children to connect with where their food comes from.



THE INTERCONNECTIONS OF GLOUCESTERSHIRE'S FOOD SYSTEM



The Covid-19 pandemic, and – more recently – soaring food prices have focused attention on how local areas meet the challenges of a fractured food system.

Local Food Partnerships (LFPs) are embedding and amplifying their work to deliver both local and national food priorities. They have been uniquely placed to provide systems leadership and practical solutions through the strategic direction and support of the UK-wide Sustainable Food Places (SFP) programme, established a decade prior to the pandemic.

LFPs have been able to pivot to respond with agility to an extended period of national crisis and have moved forward to offer a coherent framework for the transition of local food systems. The four dimensions of 'effectiveness', 'efficiency', 'engagement', and 'equity' highlight the value of LFPs to fill the leadership gap on local food issues.

Project Grow – Claire Dovey

Claire Dovey told us about Project Grow who are one of twenty different community growing groups in Cheltenham, with a focus of working together and how they have formed a new network- the Community Growing Group - who have mapped out what good food provision currently is across Cheltenham and are exploring ways to create a vibrant, healthier, sustainable and more equitable food system for Cheltenham.

Claire also introduced us to The Love Food Hub an organisation which are planning to provide Pay as You Can freezer meals and have recently opened a community fridge.

Planet Cheltenham - Raechel Kelly

Raechel told us of the Planet Cheltenham initiative and how they are working to raise awareness of climate change and the projects they are currently working on from a new eco building in St Pauls, the Climate Change Makers and the Youth Climate Group, to their upcoming Community Fridge and Library of Things.

Raechel also told us about People, Planet, Pint a bi-monthly networking event which focuses on connecting people who are passionate about climate change and sustainability.


